**ORDER**

Before **MATHESON**, **McKAY**, and **BALDOCK**, Circuit Judges.

This matter is before the court on the parties' status reports. The governmental defendants suggest that additional status reports should be scheduled for September 12, 2017, to allow incoming officials an opportunity to evaluate further the issues in these cases. The plaintiffs in Case Nos. 13-1540 and 14-6028, on the other hand, assert that the

parties have conducted more settlement negotiations and ask only for two weeks to report to the court on whether the parties can reach an agreement. The plaintiffs in No. 14-6026 take still a different approach, asking the court to inquire of the government why that particular appeal should continue in light of the rulemaking the government has suggested is occurring.

Upon consideration of the parties' status reports, we direct the parties to file simultaneous status reports on September 12, 2017. If circumstances warrant advice to the court earlier than September 12, the parties may file status reports sooner describing what events have occurred and suggesting how those events may impact future proceedings in these appeals.
